Court Report

Important Park District Update:

The Park District has initiated an effort to improve the lawns at the Bowling Green and is reseeding both courts. With the support from a consultant hired by the Park District, the weeds on the west court were treated and the lawn was seeded last fall with a hybrid bluegrass. More seed was planted this spring. This year work was started on the east lawn. In the last month, the weeds were treated, and the court was seeded. Tom O'Laughlin has spoken with both the Park District supervisor and the consultant hired to provide advice. They both seemed committed to restoring the lawn to a more playable condition but said that it might take a while given that the best time for seeding is late spring and early autumn. They asked us to be patient.




Dave and Ellen took Third Place in Doubles play in their flight, and Dave took Second Place in his Singles Flight.
