Tips on Golf Croquet Strategy

It's your turn to play. You look at the ball positions on the court and think, "What should I do?" In a recent United States Croquet Association (USCA) newsletter, Cheryl Bromley wrote an article on basic striker strategy for golf croquet. Ms. Bromley is currently ranked #10 in the United States for golf croquet and #1 for US women. She suggests that you ask yourself these 4 basic questions every turn:

- 1. Can I make the wicket?
- 2. What about the danger ball? (The danger ball is the ball that follows your ball in play rotation.)
- 3. Can I help my partner make the wicket?
- 4. Are there any other threats by the hoop from the opponent balls?
